Illustration 2: add a mark for the bottom of the keyhole slit, paper should now be marked as above.




Illustration 3: Connect lines as shown. You now have a neckline that fits.




Illustration 4: draw line on inside of black line for cutting (adding seam allowance)

Now you have a pattern that fits the neck of the person who's hand was used. Cut on the red line and place cut out on fabric for pattern. The short part goes to the back, the widest part on shoulders. Slit as deeply as you like for a keyhole neckline, but 6 inches is generally the most you will ever need. Finish as desired.
